

# VACCINATED TRAVEL LANE (VTL) FOR PASSENGERS ENTERING & TRANSITING THROUGH SINGAPORE

Am I eligible to fly on a VTL flight?

These requirements apply for all VTL flights arriving in Singapore on or after **19 October 2021** and VTL flights from South Korea on or after **15 November 2021**.

For flights arriving prior to 19 October please refer to either the [Germany VTL](#) or [Brunei VTL](#) requirements PDF.



Have you remained in Singapore and/or any VTL approved country for at least **14 days before departure?**

Any days spent in Singapore prior to arriving in a VTL country will count toward the 14 days.  
Transiting through a country without leaving the airport is still considered part of travel history.

**Are you fully vaccinated** against Covid-19 with a PSAR or World Health Organisation Emergency Use Listing vaccine?

You must hold a digitally certifiable vaccination certificate<sup>1</sup> in English.  
Mix of approved vaccines<sup>2</sup> is possible.  
The final dose was administered at least 14 days prior to your intended date of entry into Singapore.  
Fully recovered Covid-19 travellers are eligible, conditions apply<sup>3</sup>.

**💡 Travelling with Children?**  
Children under the age of 12<sup>7</sup> travelling with a fully vaccinated eligible traveller are exempted from this requirement.

<sup>1</sup>Vaccination certificates issued in Singapore or any VTL country, the European Union Digital Covid Certificate (EUDCC) issued in European VTL countries, and the UK's National Health Service (NHS) Covid passes downloaded from the NHS mobile app. For travellers vaccinated in Canada and the USA, only vaccination certificates issued in the SMART Health Card (SHC) format by issuers in Canada and the USA on the Common Trust Network are accepted. CovPass or the International Certificate of Vaccination or Prophylaxis (ICVP), also known as the Carte Jaune or Yellow Card, will not be accepted as proof of vaccination. Vaccination certificates issued in South Korea will be accepted from 15 November 2021.

<sup>2</sup>To be considered fully vaccinated, travellers require two shots of an approved vaccine, or one shot of the Johnson & Johnson vaccine.

<sup>3</sup>Residents of the EU, the UK, or Singapore who were previously unvaccinated and had recovered from a past Covid-19 infection are considered fully vaccinated if they have received at least one dose of an approved vaccine. Such travellers will be required to provide an EU or NHS recovery certificate from Covid-19, or a discharge memo issued in Singapore. Vaccination to be taken at least 28 days after the date when the traveller first tested positive and at least 14 days prior to arrival in Singapore.

<sup>4</sup>All PCR Test results to be received in English.

<sup>5</sup>VTP applications process is available for Brunei and Germany. South Korea VTP applications will be available from 8 November 2021, 10:00am(SGT). All other VTP applications will be available from 12 October 2021, 10:00am(SGT).

<sup>6</sup>Insurance Coverage for Covid-19 medical treatment and hospitalisation costs.

<sup>7</sup>Children aged 12 years and below in the calendar year e.g. only children born in or after 2009 will be exempted in 2021. These children are also not required to apply for a VTP. Infants two years and below born in the calendar year e.g. only infants born in 2019 will be exempt from the pre-departure test and on-arrival tests. Children travelling as a short-term visitor will require Covid-19 Insurance Coverage. Children aged 6 years and below in the calendar year are exempted from the TraceTogether requirement.
